Programme Enrolment and Participation Prerequisites:

To fully participate in the Faculty of Economics' English Track Programme (English curriculum programme), applicants must adequately demonstrate their proficiency level of the English language. Applicants' English proficiency will be evaluated on an individual basis using one, or a combination, of the following means:

- Standardized English exams (examples and minimum scores listed below)
- **English entrance exam** offered by the Faculty of Economics (**7th September, 2011, 10 a.m. room B**, Faculty of Economics, building D)
- Relative and applicable English language academic experiences (i.e.: International High School Programmes, Study Abroad Programmes, etc.)

The following list of English exams is a guideline used to establish the minimum level of proficiency. This guideline is not exclusive and other exams may be considered on an individual basis.

Applicants wishing to **present** English exam scores must present current, **valid and official certifications** (**7th September, 2011, 9 a.m. room B**, Faculty of Economics, building D), which may not be dated prior to 2009.

If a student doesn't have one of the above mentioned certifications, they may participate in the programme after completing an initial English language assessment given by our English language staff of professors and *lettori*. This assessment is designed to illustrate a student's current English language abilities and readiness for the programme. Should a student score below the minimum requirements of this assessment, the Faculty of Economics offers a complementary English tutorial programme that coincides with the Faculty's English curriculum programme. This tutorial programme is designed to help students improve their language abilities.

Examination Prerequisites:

Prior to taking any of the exams within the Faculty of Economics' English Track Programme (ETP), students **must** present documentation of the successful completion of one of the above mentioned standardized proficiency examinations or the results of a satisfactory performance on English language assessment offered by the Faculty of Economics.
